## Student Visa Categories

### Student Visa (Tier 4 replacement):

- For students 16 years and older
- Studying at licensed institutions
- Courses longer than 6 months

### Short-term Study Visa:

- No work rights
- Cannot extend or switch visa types

### Child Student Visa:

- For students under 18
- Additional safeguarding requirements

- Valid for 6 months from issue date

- London: £1,334 per month
- Outside London: £1,023 per month
- Must show funds for 9 months

### English Language Requirements:

- SELT (Secure English Language Test) from approved provider
- Minimum level varies by course level
- Some exemptions for nationals of majority English-speaking countries

### **Tuberculosis Testing:**

- Required for Indian nationals
- From approved clinic
- Valid for 6 months

### **Academic Issues:**

- Qualification not suitable for course level
- Poor academic progression
- Unrealistic course choice

### **English Language:**

- Insufficient English level
- Test from non-approved provider
- Test results too old

## **Post-Arrival Requirements**

### **Biometric Residence Permit (BRP):**

- Collect within 10 days of arrival
- Serves as proof of right to study and work
- Required for all stays longer than 6 months

**Police Registration:**

- Required if staying longer than 6 months
- Must register within 7 days of arrival
- Update with any address changes

**University Registration:**

- Complete enrollment process
- Confirm course details match CAS
- Update contact information
